The Parade – Circular walk – Approximately 7km.

Starting and finishing at the parade in Liskeard, about a ten-minute drive from Hoburne Doublebois, this circular walk is a stunning walk through Cornish history, crossing part of the popular Caradon Trail.

If walking in winter, be sure to wear some wellies or walking boots as you will be crossing a shallow (but sometimes swollen) stream and taking the muddy track alongside High Wood.

- 1. Head North towards Barras Place and take the left fork when you reach the top.
- 2. Next, take the steep walk down Venslooe Hill and all the way up the other side, taking in the medieval fields on other side.
- 3. Soon you will see the disused Liskeard and Caradon Railway bridge, pass underneath this and then cross the Looe River. Continue to climb until you see the sign for the footpath on a bank to the left.
- 4. Navigate the stile and continue straight ahead to the next one before crossing the field ahead of you.
- 5. When you reach the far side, you will see steps leading down to Treworgey Manor

 Drive, bear left here and left again opposite the house to go through iron gates into the parkland.
- 6. Travel ahead into the woodland, emerging through a gate at the far end.
- 7. Walk diagonally to the corner of the field and cross the small stream. Here you can decide whether to go right through the field or whether to follow the lane to the four-way junction and take a sharp left down the track to the side of the house.
- 8. This track runs parallel with the stream (to the right) and the woods (to the left) all the way to Looe Miils. Note the old tunnel beneath the railway and the mill house at the end.
- 9. After the toll lodge, turn left along the path beside the A38 and walk until you reach a minor road by the underpass. Take a left here and climb the wooded hill on Old Road to take in stunning views across the valley.
- 10. Return to your starting point of the parade travelling along West Street.
